#### 071015 District Councillor News

At the Special Council meeting on 19th November, the main item on the agenda was the Local Plan. This was recommended for adoption by the Planning Strategy Manager.

Having had due regard to the appointed Planning Inspector's report, and after receiving replies from the Manager on a couple of questions from Members, the Local Plan was voted through unanimously by those Members present. The Plan came into effect immediately, which means that the LPA will now have much more clout in its armoury to withstand speculative applications by predatory developers on land not included as strategic development sites within that Plan. There is a statutory 6 week consultation

period for minor amendments to be made, if necessary, but Strategic Planning is not expecting anything significant to come forward.

It's worth noting the Robert Hitchins withdrew their Appeal against refusal to build 95 houses on land adjacent to School Lane in Whitminster, just before the Local Plan was adopted. They obviously thought that they couldn't win the Appeal, after reading the Inspector's Report, and having their land West of Stonehouse allocated in the Report for development.

The LPA can now demonstrate in excess of a 5 year land supply for house building, which is a requirement of planning legislation. There will be a review of the Local Plan, starting in about 2 years' time, to see how it is progressing. To start that off, a Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA) will have to be carried out, as was done in about 2011 for this Plan. I fully expect many landowners will be putting forward parcels of land, as they did previously, that have not been included in this Plan.

A progress report was given on Devolution to Gloucestershire. The signs at the moment are looking positive. There is one stumbling block, if the Whitehall Mandarins insist on Gloucestershire having an Elected Mayor, which none of the participants in the bid want, then that could scupper the whole process. Time will tell on that.

The final item on the agenda was to delegate authority to the Environment Committee to streamline the process for those parishes or neighbourhoods wishing to work up and adopt a Neighbourhood Plan. This will enable those parishes to be able to do it more quickly than at present, without the previous "red tape" to have to overcome. Again, this went through unanimously.

I am currently working with Officers at Ebley Mill, in Licensing, Environment Protection and the Legal Team, to make the General Public more aware of hazards caused by "Chinese Flying Lanterns" and late night firework displays, particularly those taking place at wedding venues in rural areas, and where local neighbours are not notified, so that they would be able to keep pets and animals, eg, horses, indoors. While not wanting the Council to have by-laws which are probably unenforceable, or to become a "nanny" Council, some of us feel that the public in general ought to be more aware that fireworks can cause problems for pets etc, and that flying lantern remains, particularly the wire frame if it goes through a forage harvester when making silage, can have a devastating effect on livestock if ingested.
