The Neighbourhood Warden Team install, maintain and service the Careline equipment across the Stroud District, so far this quarter we have visited 267 customers.

Careline

Our Careline Service plays a key role in helping vulnerable people or/and older people to live independently and safely in their own homes. The service can provide vital reassurance to residents and their family and friends when they need it most.

What is a Careline?

Careline is an effective way of getting help through your landline telephone line quickly and efficiently 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

How does it work?

By pressing a necklace or wrist pendant a signal is sent to the Careline, which will then automatically dial to our Control Room. Your personal details will come up on a computer screen and a fully-trained operator will be able to talk to you through the Careline unit.

How will they help me?

The Control Room will quickly establish what assistance you require i.e. an Ambulance, Doctor or one of your nominated contacts (neighbour, friend or family).

The Careline is a chargeable service, for details please give us a call.
