091123 Clerks Report - Feedback from items raised at the last meeting and other points to be discussed.

- Canal notice board cost has been approved but the request to look into a double-sided board has delayed the ordering.
 Councillors agreed that a one sided board was more appropriate, the budget has already been approved at the 2nd November meeting
- 2. Commemorative plaque for the Oak Trees has been purchased. This has now been received.
- Inspection of the play equipment on the Memorial Hall Playing Field has been confirmed, lead time 12 – 16 weeks.
- 4. Remembrance Sunday Wreaths were laid, thank you to Cllrs Findlater (St Mary's, Fretherne) and Jeffries (St James, Saul) and Parishioner T Lever (St Peters, Upper Framilode)
- The overhanging branch along the canal tow path will be removed on 4th December
- 6. The Bauble competition and Christmas on the Pound advertising was carried out via the website, social media and flyers to households within the Parish.
- 7. Gloucestershire Highways have authorised payment of the verge cutting costs, payment received.
- 8. The Extraction figures (nil) have been submitted to the Environment Agency.

To confirm the decision to replace of styles with Kissing Gates on Public Rights of Way (PROW).

The Parish Council have identified the styles which are considered to be in a poor condition and would have the most impact by being replaced by Kissing Gates. The PROW officer has been informed and is now reviewing these styles. Landowners will be contacted for permission to replace the old style.

To confirm compliance with the 1st January 2024 deadline for all Town and Parish Councils to take their first actions for Biodiversity under the Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006.

All local authorities have to sign the Biodiversity agreement by 1st January 2024. They are encouraged to detail their efforts to encourage biodiversity in their areas. Fretherne with Saul Parish Council are encouraging Biodiversity by planting the three oak trees, the planned work on the disused section of Stroudwater Canal, encouraging the recreational activities of parishioners and visitors to the area with making Public Rights of Way more accessible. Further ideas to encourage Biodiversity are to be included in the budget discussions. The Biodiversity Policy was adopted.

161123 To receive a final update on Christmas on the Pound 2023, 2nd December at 6pm

Flyers and posters have been sent out around the Parish about the Christmas Bauble competition and Christmas on the Pound. The website and the community Facebook page have been updated with all the details. The trees are in the process of being decorated in anticipation of the lights being switched on. Has anything been forgotten? Final details, times were discussed and agreed.

171123 To receive an update on the commissioned survey on the disused section of the Stroudwater Canal at Upper Framilode.

Work on the canal has been temporarily suspended with the exception of strengthening the dam below the bridge on Moor Street and the removal of the duck weed. The report for the survey which was carried out by Wild Service in early October has been received. A public meeting, which the Parish will be invited to attend, will be organised after the Parish Councillors have considered the report.

A discussion took place around certain points on the report and it was found that some points needed clarifying. It was agreed that the Councillors needed more time to thoroughly review the details and raise any gueries with Wild Service before publishing the report and setting a date for a meeting.

Action: the Clerk to collate the Councillors queries and present them to Wild Service

181123 To begin discussion on the budget including projects for the coming year

Councillors have been considering possible projects to be included in a business plan for the next three years, costs are being researched and budgetary discussion can now begin. Items to be considered include:-

- Adult outdoor circuit training equipment will no longer be considered as it is considered of not sufficient demand by the Parish
- Parish Gateways Plans to introduce Parish Gateways has been put on hold for the next financial year as the cost implication for installation is considered too great.
- The clearing/replacement of existing down pipes draining into the canal along the length of the disused section of the Stroudwater Canal at Upper Framilode to 'top up' the water levels through out the year reducing the need to pump water into the canal. This will, if successful, reduce the need to hire in pumping equipment.
- In partnership with Stroud District Councils PROW (Public Rights of Way) team, replacing the damaged and dilapidated styles around the Parish with Kissing Gates. The PROW team are considering the styles identified as most in need of replacement, do the Parish Council want to consider other styles around the Parish for replacement.
- To consider providing information boards at key locations in the Parish Stroudwater canal and Saul
- Pound. These would include the history of the Parish, it's buildings, key locations and photographs. Biodiversity around the Parish. As of 1st January 2024, all local government authorities have to signed the Biodiversity Policy. Ways in which Biodiversity can be promoted in the Parish will be discussed.

The proposed budget figures were discussed and the proposed Business Plan items listed above were discussed. It was proposed that further discussion would take place at the January meeting to finalise the budget and quotes would be sourced for items on the business plan.

Action: the Clerk to update the Proposed Business Plan with details discussed and to source quotes for items which received positive comments

Chairman moved to extend the meeting past the two hours agreed time.

To discuss the work to replace down pipes along the disused Stroudwater Canal. By replacing and restoring the down pipes is hoped to alleviate the need to hire expensive pumping equipment each year. A second quote has been received, Council to consider the quote.

A second quote has been received. Councillors need the quote to list the breakdown of the drainage maintenance work and have asked that it be then resubmitted however, the quote has been approved in principal. Proposed, seconded with all in favour.
